In this 3 hour workshop, Mother/Daughter team Molly and Courtney Blazon, will take you on a journey as you create a small mixed media sculpture with found objects. Then you will imagine a life for your newly reimagined sculpture with a narrative drawing. Mason jars, Altoid tins, and a variety of different found objects will be available to use. You are more than welcome to bring things personal to you to enhance the connection you have to the creation as well! Narratives will be made using simple drawing materials on Mylar. Mylar is a wonderful translucent surface that enhances the feeling of memory and ghostliness that the sculptures may conjure up.

The process of creating a 3-D sculpture with found objects and then responding to the sculpture by drawing a narrative representation will strengthen and enhance your understanding of 3-D and 2-D processes, materials and methods. This will also show how they can co-exist to create a fluid yet complex concept which can strengthen the your content, visually and metaphorically.

Try something new, have fun and bring deep meaning to your work.
